Case Management Competencies

- Angela carefully considers pathways and options for treatment, along with appropriate timescales, to ensure that her clients benefit from their rehabilitation and achieve the best possible outcomes.
- She communicates effectively and works collaboratively with clients, their families, the multidisciplinary team (MDT), and referring parties to ensure that rehabilitation remains client-centred and responsive to changing needs throughout each client's rehabilitation journey.
- Angela considers clients holistically, taking into account the potential factors that may influence rehabilitation outcomes, such as language or cultural barriers, social support, and financial challenges.
- She empowers and advocates for her clients within their support systems and MDTs, as well as with referring parties.
- Angela actively participates in UPL peer meetings, conferences, events, and other learning opportunities. She regularly reflects on both her clients' rehabilitation journeys and her own learning experiences to inform and guide her future professional development.
- She is flexible and adaptable in her approach to Case Management, enabling her to prioritise effectively and make necessary changes in response to the competing demands and needs of her caseload.
- Her Expert Witness work supports her Case Management role and responsibilities; she has a clear understanding of the litigation process and her professional responsibilities as a Case Manager.
- Angela considers the cost efficacy of interventions, explores alternative options, and works within appropriate timescales to plan for discharge.
- She makes effective use of supervision and safeguarding procedures to identify and manage potential risks.

Case Examples

- Angela supported a young man following a motorcycle accident to successfully return to his manual work role and leisure activities through timely and holistic case management. Her interventions included early risk mitigation, coordination of assistive equipment, and facilitating home and workplace physiotherapy. She arranged a graded return-to-work plan in collaboration with a specialist therapist. To overcome transport barriers, Angela supported him to complete an intensive driving course, which enabled greater independence, sustained employment, and progress toward his pre-injury vocational goals.
- Angela supported a 60-year-old client who sustained right upper limb fractures, peripheral nerve injuries, facial and jaw fractures, and psychological trauma following a motorbike vs car accident. She coordinated a comprehensive rehabilitation plan that included specialist physiotherapy to enable a return to leisure activities such as coarse and sea fishing, vestibular and cognitive rehabilitation for mild TBI, and psycho-education. Angela also facilitated input from a speech and language therapist and a dietician to improve oral nutrition, while managing NHS and private pathways to optimise recovery outcomes.
