## Case Examples

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Male in his 60's, self-employed builder, RTC car vs motorbike, significant polytrauma; complex lower limb salvage, complex pelvic fracture, peripheral nerve injuries affecting lower limb function, internal injuries and right upper limb fracture. Facilitated inpatient rehabilitation and orthotics (for complex pelvic fractures) to manage functional ability for lower limb.

Male in his 20's, restaurant manager, RTC car vs motorbike, ORIF for lower limb fracture. Facilitated client with returning to work with the same employer, physiotherapy, gym, and psychology support to assist with adjustment post injuries.

Male 55, pedestrian vs car, polytrauma, psychological injuries and, mild traumatic brain injury. Supported a swift return to work and re-engagement in active family life, with the input of a multidisciplinary therapy team to support persisting difficulties that were being perpetuated by a psychological (functional) presentation.
